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MADE IN GREEN by OEKO-TEX®: New regulations in 2020

At the start of the year, the OEKO-TEX® Association as usual updated the applicable test criteria and limit values for its range of certifications. For MADE IN GREEN by OEKO-TEX® the following new regulations come into effect immediately:

MADE IN GREEN by OEKO-TEX® is now applicable for leather products

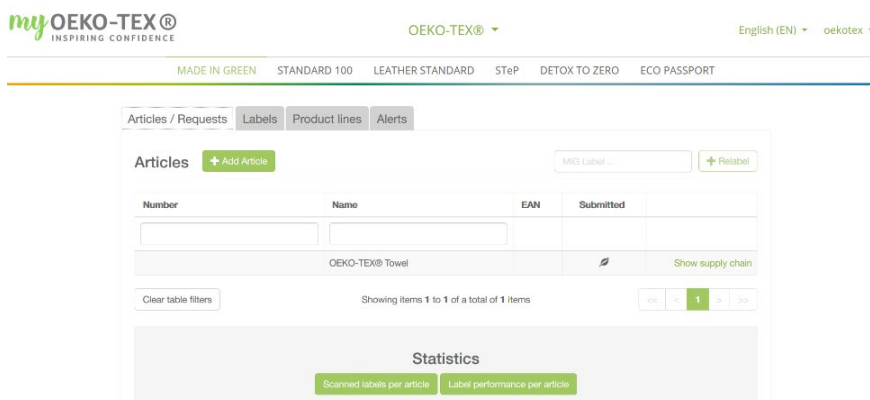
After the STeP assessment was extended to leather production sites in spring 2019, the integration of leather products is now also taking place at MADE IN GREEN by OEKO-TEX®. Analogous to textiles labelled with MADE IN GREEN, the labelled leather articles are tested for harmful substances according to LEATHER STANDARD by OEKO-TEX® and sustainably produced according to STeP Sustainable Textile & Leather Production by OEKO-TEX®. Consumers of leather goods such as clothing, shoes or furniture can now also trace back the countries and production plants in which they were produced by means of a unique product ID on the label. Through more transparent supply chains, it is now also possible for brands, suppliers, retailers and manufacturers to organize their suppliers more specifically with regard to the desired quality, efficiency, environmental friendliness and social working conditions.



New design of MADE IN GREEN dashboard

Together with the release of the new myOEKO-TEX® platform the MADE IN GREEN dashboard was redesigned. The dashboard is now more user-friendly providing several options for brands, retailers and manufacturers:

- Create MADE IN GREEN articles
- Generate MADE IN GREEN labels
- Manage the MADE IN GREEN supply chain
- Perform evaluations and set targets
